




Shutterists 2024 monthly challenge

Gastro Jaunts in Norfolk Part 14:

"We thought it was about time we went on another jaunt around Norfolk and as it was our 55th wedding anniversary we thought we'd splash out and booked a lovely apartment 5 minutes' walk from the town centre and beach promenade of Sheringham.

We ate out most days but for brevity's sake I've just chosen the best and worst. Before I start, I must mention "The Hub" This is a café attached to the Sheringham Little Theatre, it is run by volunteers, serves great teas, coffees. cakes and light lunches at very reasonable prices with all proceeds going to the upkeep of the theatre. A very worthy cause.

The worst experience was The Dun Cow, on the coast at Salthouse near Holt. The pub itself was fine, the staff, service and food were good, but the pub was full of braying hooray Henries and Henriettas no doubt down from London for the weekend, staying at mummy and daddy's second home on the North Norfolk coast together with their numerous yappy dogs and precocious children. Added to this, the parking was a nightmare around the tiny pothole ridden village green. We came away vowing never to return.

By contrast we had one of the best lunches we have ever eaten at "Rocky Bottoms" just outside West Runton, with fabulous views over the marshes to the sea. It is a seafood restaurant where they claim that most of the fish and seafood is locally caught by the proprietors each morning and I believe them. We had Brancaster oysters to start with, the freshest I've ever tasted, my wife Chas had the warm lobster salad and I opted for the pan-fried haddock, both were perfectly cooked and delicious. The service was excellent, the waitresses (are we allowed to use this word in the Woke World we live in today?) were friendly, enthusiastic, intelligent, and obviously enjoying their jobs. Parking was a breeze in the large rustic (we were parked next to a tractor) car park on the road to Cromer. All in all, this was the highlight of our stay. We'll be back!"
