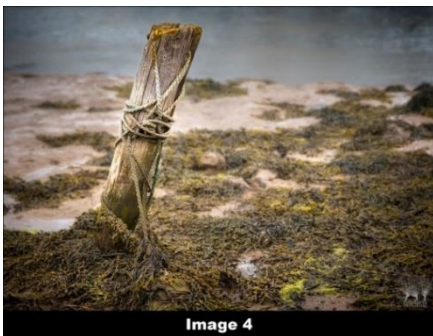

## Gastro Jaunts around East Anglia (part 5):

*“Something a little bit different this month. We’d booked to go on the Shed trip to the ‘Cromer Pier Summer Show’ and I’d read a few good reviews of the ‘Number One’ fish restaurant which overlooks the sea, so I booked a table for two overlooking the pier for our pre-show lunch.*

*The restaurant is run by the Michelin starred chef ‘Galton Blackiston’ who owns the ‘Morston Hall Country House Hotel and Restaurant’ (you’ll need to save up your pennies for that one – seriously expensive!), so we thought we would give it a try.*

*The ground floor is your traditional fish and chip shop but booking a table is not possible, first come first served only, whereas upstairs it is more of a fish and seafood restaurant with sea views and booking recommended.*

*There were a few of us from the Shed having lunch there and opinions varied, as for myself and my better half (she may be reading this) we had the smoked mackerel scotch eggs for starters which were great, followed by lobster thermidor for madam (what else?) and cod and chips for me. The lobster was declared excellent, and my cod and chips were good, although I was expecting something a little bit different for the price. I regretted not going for the freshly caught seabass, but thought I had to see how their cod and chips compared to ‘Little Gary’s Plaice’ (very well). For dessert we had an excellent lemon posset. Chas had a nice glass of rosé, and I had a very good bottle of cider.*

*I wasn’t expecting much change out of £100, which was lucky as I didn’t get any, although to their credit there were no automatically added and often undeserved, service charge, that one gets in so many restaurants these days. We’d had a good meal with good service, excellent atmosphere, and sea views, that and a great end of the pier show made for a lovely day out. “*
